

## NECROLOGY

Edward Cardinal Mooney (1958)

Born, Mt. Savage, Md., May 8, 1892. Ordained in Rome, April 10, 1909. Professor of Dogmatic Theology, St. Mary's Sem., Cleveland 1909-16. Headmaster, Cathedral Latin Sch., Cleveland 1916-22. Pastor, St. Patrick's Church, Youngstown 1922-23. Spiritual Director, North American College, Rome 1923-26. Appointed Apostolic Delegate to India and consecrated titular archbishop of Irenopolis, 1926. Apostolic Delegate to Japan, 1931. Bishop of Rochester 1933-37. Appointed archbishop of Detroit, 1937. Created Cardinal Priest of the title of S. Susanna, Feb. 18, 1946.

László Torontáli, S.P. (1957)

Born, Pancsova, Hungary (now Yugoslavia), March 4, 1917. Ordained, Budapest, June 14, 1942. Educated, Gymnasium, Budapest; Piarist Novitiate, 1935-36; Calasantium (S.T.L.) and Pázmány University, Budapest (M.A.), 1936-42. Teacher at Piarist schools of Kolozsvár, Nagy-Károly, Szeged. Escaped Communist Hungary, 1948. Taught in Rome, Barcelona, Buffalo and Philadelphia.

Thomas Plassmann, O.F.M. (1959)

Born, March 19, 1879, Avenwedde, Westphalia, Germany. Received Franciscan habit September 11, 1898. Ordained, Washington, June 9, 1906. Studies at Catholic University, Appolinaris, Bonn, Louvain and Palestine. President of St. Bonaventure, 1920-47. Rector, Christ the King Seminary, 1952-59. Received Lector Generalis in S.S. from International College of St. Antony, Rome, 1931. Named *Lector Jubilatus* in 1953. Author of many books; contributor to Catholic Encyclopedia, and scholarly periodicals, including *Catholic Biblical Quarterly*, *Franciscan Studies*, *American Ecclesiastical Review*, *Homiletic and Pastoral Review*, *Archivum Franciscanum Historicum* and *The Cord*.

Louis E. Sullivan, S.J. (1959)

Born, Boston, January 27, 1895. Ordained, Weston, June 23, 1927. Educated, St. Andrew-on-Hudson, Poughkeepsie, N. Y., 1914-18; 1928-29; Woodstock College, Woodstock, Md. 1918-21; 1924-27; Weston College, Weston, Mass, 1927-28; Gregorian University, Rome, 1929-1931 (S.T.D.) Teacher, Fordham Preparatory School, 1922-24. Professor of Metaphysics, Weston, 1931-33. Professor of Theology for 25 years: Weston, 1933-41; 1945-59; Alma, California, 1941-43; Immaculée, Montreal, 1943-44. Assistant Editor, *America*, 1944-45.
