John Cardinal O'Hara, C.S.C. (1960)

Born, Ann Harbor, Mich., May 1, 1888. Student at Cathedral Prep., Brooklyn, N. Y., Jesuit College, Montevideo, Uruguay; University of Notre Dame, Catholic University of America, Holy Cross College, Washington, D. C., and University of Pennsylvania. Ordained, September 9, 1916. Instructor in Religion, Prefect of Religion, Dean of College of Commerce, Vice President and President, University of Notre Dame. Auxiliary bishop of Army and Navy Diocese, 1939-45; Bishop of Buffalo, 1945-51; Archbishop of Philadelphia, 1951-60. Named Cardinal Priest by Pope John XXIII, 1958. Died, August 28, 1960.

Daniel T. McColgan (1959)

Born, Charlestown, Mass., April 24, 1911. Ordained, Boston, Mass., December 17, 1937. Made Domestic Prelate, May 11, 1953. Educated at Boston College; St. John's Seminary, Brighton; Catholic University of America, Washington, D. C. Author of many books and contributor to scholarly periodicals. Professor of Moral Theology, Sociology and Pastoral Theology, St. John's Seminary; Professor of Sociology, Regis College, Weston, Mass. Died, October 15, 1959.

John P. O'Connell (1960)

Born, Chicago, Illinois, January 12, 1918. Ordained, St. Mary of the Lake Seminary, Mundelein, Illinois, May 1, 1943. Awarded S.T.D. in 1945. Editor of *Family Bible*. Member of Mariological Society, Catholic Biblical Association, Liturgical Conference. Contributor to *American Ecclesiastical Review*, *The Furrow*, *The Sword*, *Homiletic and Pastoral Review*, *Catholic Biblical Quarterly*. Made Papal Chamberlain, December 28, 1959. Died, February 20, 1960.

James F. Redding (1960)

Born, Lowell, Massachusetts, June 7, 1915. Ordained, Boston, May 1, 1942. Educated at Boston College, St. John's Seminary, Brighton, Harvard School of Education, Fordham University (Ph.D., 1950). Author of *The Philosophic Modernism of Nicholas A. Berdyaev* (Boston, 1945); *The Virtue of Prudence in the Writings of St. Thomas Aquinas* (New York, 1950). Contributor to *Thought*, *The Pilot*, *Best Sellers*. Professor of Philosophy and Moral Theology, St. John's Seminary, Brighton, Mass. 1955-1960. Died, May 12, 1960.

Thomas C. Mulligan, S.S. (1960)

Born, Eagle Grove, Iowa, September 9, 1892. Ordained, June 25, 1916. Educated: Columbia College (now Loras), Dubuque, Iowa (A.B.); Le Grand Séminaire, Montreal, Canada; The Angelicum, Roma (S.T.D.); University of Washington, Seattle, Wash. (M.A.). Professor of Philosophy, St. Mary's Semi-

nary, Baltimore, Md. Professor of Theology, Sulpician Seminary, Washington, D. C., St. Edward's Seminary, Kenmore, Wash., St. Mary's Seminary, Baltimore, Md., St. Patrick's Seminary, Menlo Park, Calif. Professor of Latin, St. Charles College, Catonsville, Md. and St. Thomas Seminary, Louisville, Ky. First President, Basselin Foundation of the Catholic University of America, Washington, D. C. (1923-1930). First President, St. Edward's Seminary, Kenmore, Wash. (1931-1943). Rector, St. Patrick's Seminary, Menlo Park, Calif. (1944-1957). Died June 7, 1960, Louisville, Ky.

J. Cyril Dukehart, S.S. (1960)

Born, Baltimore, Md., November 3, 1905. Ordained, Baltimore, Md., June 16, 1932. Educated, St. Charles College, Catonsville, Md.; St. Mary's Seminary, Baltimore, Md. (A.B., J.C.B.); University of Washington, Seattle, Wash. (M.A.). Professor of Religion and History, St. Charles College, Catonsville, Md. and St. Edward's Seminary, Kenmore, Wash. Superior, St. Edward's Minor Seminary, Kenmore, Wash. (1939-1956). President, St. Charles College, Catonsville, Md. (1956-1958). Associate Secretary for the Seminary Departments, National Catholic Educational Association (1958-1960). Died June 16, 1960, Ocean City, Md.

Edmond D. Benard (1961)

Born, Boston, Massachusetts, August 1, 1914. Ordained, June 7, 1941. Studied at Holy Cross College, Worcester, Mass.; Grand Seminary of Montreal; University of Montreal, Catholic University of America. Joined the Faculty of Theology, Catholic University, October, 1943; appointed Dean of School of Theology, December, 1959. Associate Editor of *American Ecclesiastical Review*; author of *The Appeal to the Emotions in Preaching*, 1944; *A Preface to Newman's Theology*, 1945; co-editor of *American Essays for the Newman Centennial*, 1947. President of CTSA, 1951-52; recipient of Cardinal Spellman Award, 1955. Theological Editor of *The New Catholic Encyclopedia*. Died, Washington, February 4, 1961.
